We want our students to stride out of Wimbledon High School into the world and shake it up.



THE DEPARTMENT

Psychology is taught as a sixth form subject at WHS and has grown rapidly over the past year as the subject has been reintroduced to the school. It is a hugely successful and popular subject, with a number of students applying to study Psychology at University.

A Level Psychology at Wimbledon High School aims to provide students with a solid foundation in psychological theories and concepts, analytical skills, and the ability to critically analyse psychological issues and research. The department aims to foster and facilitate academic curiosity amongst students and encourages pupils to enrich their learning beyond the subject specification. It prepares them for further studies in psychology, neuroscience, sociology, or related fields, as well as equipping them with valuable skills for their future careers and everyday decision-making. The department contributes to the wider co-curricular life of the school with our popular Get Psyched club that enables students to investigate and discuss interesting and diverse topics relevant to the field of Psychology, and we will be looking to expand this wider provision with this appointment.


ATTITUDE/APPROACH

Wimbledon High School is conveniently situated in the heart of Wimbledon. The station is a few minutes' walk away, serving National Rail, London Underground and Tramlink.
